So far this year, the College has celebrated the opening of the Mohawk Learning Exchange with the new Cummings Library and Collaboratory, and just last month, Mohawk opened The Square, a new student services centre that consolidates services once offered at 17 different locations throughout the campus. The result is that Mohawk has the high-quality facilities to match its high-quality staff and faculty. And our students agree.

Every year since 1997, Ontario college students have been asked to score their college on overall satisfaction, quality of programs, learning experience, facilities and services. This year, Mohawk students gave their school top marks in all of these areas, placing the college first among all colleges in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area.

This wouldn't be possible if it weren't for a talented team of faculty and staff who work tirelessly to provide Mohawk students the best possible college experience and an education that puts them on the path to success.

What's next?

This year, Mohawk will ask students to help design a new fitness and recreation facility that is being proposed for the Fennell Campus. If built, the new centre would replace the campus' existing gymnasium and fitness facilities. The new centre would be a first-class teaching facility that will serve the fitness and recreation needs of the students at the Fennell Campus.

The College is also working with the City of Hamilton to design and build a multi-modal transit facility on the southwest corner of Fennell Avenue and West 5th. The facility will serve as a layover and transfer point for HSR buses and passengers and could eventually serve as a station along the proposed route for the City's planned rapid transit project.
